

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

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

“Shaking It Up”

One of the oldest stereotypes in the overall fraternity is that we don't embrace change. Among the illustrations of this concept is a hilarious cartoon I saw a long time ago in which a Past Master was poking his finger in the chest of the Worshipful Master, declaring, “That's not the way we did it MY year!” While there may be some truth in a resistance to change among some in the fraternity, I maintain that we haven't thrived as long as we have by being narrow-minded or unwilling to take advantage of opportunities given us throughout our history.

Much has been written by many over time about the concept of “change,” along with embracing it and using it to our personal or business advantage. Attend any conference of a trade or professional association, and there will be a session on this very topic. Every other issue

of a trade magazine or professional journal or fraternal publication will discuss it. It's really been the only constant over time, as the world has never been static. Then why do some think it's a bad thing or some negative condition that needs to be avoided?

In fact, “change” is actually a symptom of a healthy organization, not a stale, dull one. I always like to think about environmental change as “disruption” or a mere swerving off the traditional path every once in a while. To be divergent in your approach to events, meetings, parties, charitable endeavors and other Shrine fun is to keep a certain level of enthusiasm and anticipation. Really good leaders understand this concept and utilize it to move their organizations forward. They can simplify the complex, and create order and excitement out of chaos, resulting in members asking, “What's next?”

Murat, as a Shrine temple, has engaged a tremendous amount of transformation in the last couple of years, and has done it well. When lack of availability of a qualified venue for the circus came to light, (representing a disruption of a 70-year-old tradition), the nobility created a fundraiser (the spring Sportsman Raffle) to replace the income. That additional event, while being much more time and volunteer-friendly,

will likely meet or exceed a typical circus bottom line. This was a calculated, strategic reaction to a negative situation that created a positive outcome.

To the other end of the spectrum, we're in the process of investigating a new headquarters for our beloved temple. This is an example of an organization that was presented with a great opportunity, and decided to embrace it, even though there would be some “unknowns” along the way (and represents a disruption of a 107-year condition). Members realized that Murat is

a fraternity, not an address; and that its members are what makes it special, not bricks and mortar. As a longtime student of organizational behavior, I can proudly tell you that only the most talented and successful organizations create great advantage out of unexpected opportunities. Again, Murat will continue to be a

better, stronger fraternity because of the talent in its membership ranks.

What's the lesson for all of us in Murat's nobility? Simple. Don't be afraid to “shake it up.” Change up your Club, Unit, or committee meeting agenda to provide something new and unexpected. Add new and different events to your calendar. Attend an event that you've never considered before. You get the idea; keeping it fresh and new keeps it exciting. As Henry Ford once said on the topic, “When you always do what you always did, you always get what you always got.”

I am seeing this positive energy on a daily basis now, with Clubs adding events to their calendars that have never been done before, and nobles seeking to form new, never-been-tried Units. So let's all make the conscious effort to always be on the lookout for that next exciting thing that takes us from predictable to exciting; from “been there” to “wow.” After all, that's probably why you joined in the first place.

The Sagamore of the Wabash Award Presented to Rasner and Genung

On January 10, 2015, during the Grand Lodge of Indiana Founders Day meeting at the Scottish Rite Cathedral in Indianapolis, Illustrious Sir William B. Rasner, P.P. and Past Grand Master Mark A. Genung received the distinctive honor of the Sagamore of the Wabash Award. The awards were presented on behalf of Indiana Governor Mike Pence by Indiana State Auditor Suzanne Crouch.

Rasner and Genung were both recognized for their distinguished service to both the State of Indiana and to the Indiana Masonic Fraternity. Both men, after accepting their respective awards, acknowledged the members of both Murat Shriner and all Freemasons in Indiana for giving them the opportunity to serve in their respective roles. Both leaders acknowledged that you don't rise to a position of leadership without a team of dedicated volunteers who give unselfishly of their most valuable resource—time.

Rasner and Genung both commented that no one serves the fraternity for honors and awards. They do it because of love of the fraternal experience and the opportunity to serve

our great philanthropies. As Shriner and Indiana Freemasons, we serve the Shriners Hospitals for Children and the Indiana Masonic Home Foundation. There is something extra special when you labor in the temple for children or the senior members of our Masonic fraternity.

The Sagamore of the Wabash Award was created during the term of Governor Ralph Gates, who served Indiana from 1945–1949. The term “sagamore” was used by the American Indian tribes of the Northeastern United States to describe a lesser chief or a great man among the tribe to whom the true chief would look for wisdom and advice. The award is the highest honor which the Governor of Indiana bestows. It is a personal tribute usually given to those who have rendered a distinguished service to the state or to the governor. Among those who have received Sagamores have been astronauts, presidents, ambassadors, artists, musicians, politicians and ordinary citizens who have contributed greatly to our Hoosier heritage.




He included important comments about setting attainable goals and improving communication. Please provide potential patients these phone numbers: Chicago hospital 773-385-KIDS (5437); Lexington hospital 800-444-8314; Cincinnati hospital 866-206-2096 (for plastic surgery) and 866-947-7840 (for burn and emergency services). If you know of a child who might benefit from our services, please give the parents this information about the ease of telephone contact.

At the seminar, it was announced Anna Harrington had



completed her walk across America in support of Shriners Hospitals for Children. While Anna was in Murat territory, she was assisted by many Murat nobles. She was met first by White County Shrine Club members, then Tippecanoe Shrine Club members. This assistance continued all the way to Cincinnati, with members of Murat Divan and many other Murat nobles. Anna began the walk to raise money and awareness for our hospitals because our Sacramento hospital successfully treated a serious case of scoliosis for her nephew. Anna walked 3,800 miles and visited nine Shriners Hospitals. The first hospital she visited was in Portland, OR, and she ended her remarkable journey at our Boston hospital. She left the Oregon coast March 1, 2014, and reached Boston January 22, 2015, where she was welcomed by hospital staff, old and new friends from various parts of the country and members of Aleppo Shriners.

As Anna Harrington demonstrated, many people volunteer to benefit Shriners International and Shriners Hospitals for Children. We know our nobles, their ladies and many other volunteers will continue their enthusiastic support, take leadership to the next level and have FUN. Thank you all for participating in this labor of love.

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
